

The track opened in September 1926 on a former large apple orchard owned by C. F. Neiswender. The greyhound racetrack thrived, in part, because race fans could spend an afternoon watching the horses at Beulah Park and an evening watching the greyhounds within the same small town.

Eight races were usually held in the well-lit facility, starting at 8 p.m. Upwards of 4,000 people attended daily races. The track was covered in cinder, sand and gravel. The plant had a cement floor laid under the stand and a tote board built on the south side of the grandstand. Owners from kennels throughout the midwest, including Chicago, participated at the track.
