Directions

From the east or west:

- I-270 south
- Exit I-270 at Grove City/U.S. 62 (Exit 2)
- South on U.S. 62/Broadway for 1.75 miles to Columbus St.
- Left on Columbus St.
- Go 0.2 miles to Dudley Ave. (opposite St. John's Lutheran Church)
- Right on Dudley Ave.
- Street ends in Windsor Park at the Evans Center

From the north or south:

- I-71 to Exit 100/Stringtown Rd.
- West on Stringtown Rd.
- Proceed for 2 miles (Stringtown Rd. becomes Columbus St. after 1 mile/at Hoover Rd.).
- Left on Dudley Ave. (opposite St. John's Lutheran Church)
- Street ends in Windsor Park at the Evans Center
