DIRECTIONS

From the North:

I-71 South to Stringtown Road (Exit #100), turn right into Grove City. Continue west 2.1 miles (Stringtown Road becomes Columbus Street at Hoover Road) to Dudley Avenue. Turn left, travel south 0.4 miles.

From the South:

I-71 North to US 62 (Exit #94) toward Harrisburg/Grove City. Turn right and proceed north 4.6 miles to Kingston Avenue. Turn right and continue southeast for 0.2 miles to Dudley Avenue. Turn right and travel south 0.1 miles.

From the East:

I-70 East to I-270 (Exit #108 A-B for Cincinnati), merge onto I-270. Proceed southwest 9.1 miles to I-71 South (Exit #55). Remain in far right lane and follow I-71 south 0.5 miles to Stringtown Road (Exit #100). Turn right and proceed west 2.1 miles (Stringtown Road becomes Columbus Street at Hoover Road) to Dudley Avenue. Turn left, travel south 0.4 miles.

From the West:

Follow I-70 East toward Columbus and merge onto I-270 (Exit # 93A toward Cincinnati). Continue on I-270 South 6.4 miles to US 62 (Exit #2) into Grove City. Turn right and travel south 1.8 miles (US 62 is Broadway) to Kingston Avenue. Turn left and proceed east 0.2 miles to Dudley Avenue. Turn right and travel south 0.1 miles.
