

ORDINANCE C-57-67

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY, EXCEPT DEDICATED STREETS AND WAYS OTHERWISE REGULATED AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it has become apparent that the regulation of parking of vehicles on public controlled property as well as private property without consent of property owners should be regulated; and

WHEREAS, such regulation directly affects the public safety and welfare in giving protection to the property owner and unlawful invasion of his property rights; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists and property owners should be protected in their property rights against unlawful use of their property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Grove City, State of Ohio, that

SECTION 1. a) The parking of vehicles on public or private property, excluding dedicated streets and ways set out for public travel and heretofore regulated, shall be prohibited without the consent of the owner of private property or the proper governmental agencies in charge of public property.

(b) No vehicle shall be parked on public property in violation of rules and regulations set out by the governmental agencies controlling the public property.

(c) No vehicle shall be parked on any private property in violation of any regulations set down by the owner of the private property.

(d) The provisions of paragraphs (a) through (c) shall not be applicable unless private or public property is posted in a conspicuous manner setting forth the prohibition of parking or the conditions and regulations under which parking is permitted.

(e) If any vehicle found upon public or private property in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter and the identity of the driver cannot be determined, the owner or person in whose name such vehicle is registered shall be held prima facie responsible for such violation.

SECTION 2. Whosoever violates any provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$50.00.

SECTION 3. That for reasons stated in the preamble hereto and made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval of the Mayor.
