WHEREAS, the South-Western City School District is seeking a \$128 million bond issue on November 3, 1998 to relieve serious overcrowding; and



WHEREAS, it is important to support the expansion of neighborhood schools and the ability for Grove City students to attend schools in their community.



SECTION 2. This resolution shall take effect at the earliest opportunity allowed by law.









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- a. Activate the emergency interrupt signal and stop eastbound traffic on SR-665 west of the Fire Station #203 exit ramp without stopping westbound traffic in front of the ramp;
 - b. At the same time, the regular traffic signal at the intersection of SR-665 and the common access driveway will stop westbound traffic and the traffic exiting the common access driveway, yet eastbound traffic will be allowed to proceed, thus providing an unobstructed travel pattern for our emergency and fire apparatus.
3. Installation of a new private service driveway connecting the common access driveway to the service area behind Fire Station #203;
 4. Removal of the existing driveway on the eastern side of Fire Station #203 and the complete restoration of the area, including seeding;
 5. Installation of a sign at the intersection of the common access driveway and the private service connecting driveway to the Fire Station #203 service area stating the following "No Thru Traffic - Fire Apparatus and Recycling Only";
 6. Provide for lighting at the intersection of the common access driveway with the private service driveway that will improve use of the rear service area and recycling center;
 7. Removal of all billboards on the shopping center property.

Again, on behalf of the Board of Trustees and the Jackson Township Fire Department, I express my appreciation to your clients for assuming responsibility for these improvements. I look forward to continue working closely with you, Skilken Properties and the Kroger Company as we implement the improvements and the easement agreement.
