Held January Fourth (4), 1960

- 1. Council met in regular session with President Harold Norris in the Chair.
- 2. Roll call showed the following councilmen present: President Harold Norris, Mr. Brinkman, Mr. Rothwell and Mr. Canter.
- 3. Mr. Rothwell moved that the minutes of Special Meeting No. 1, held December 30, 1959, be accepted as written by the Clerk. Seconded by Mr. Canter, all voting yes.
- 4. President Norris requested communications from Council. Mr. Rothwell requested that the Garbage Contract be placed on the Agenda.
- 5. CR-1-59 - Declaring it necessary to enlarge and reconstruct the sewage disposal plant and acquire land therefor, was given a second reading and was referred to the Service Committee.
- 6. Ordinance #25-59 - to change the zoning of Lot #100 of Grant's Beulah Subdivision from residential to industrial zoning was discussed. Mr. Rothwell moved that the ordinance be tabled and that a vote not be taken until January 18, 1960 due to the absence of Mr. Wagner. Seconded by Mr. Brinkman.

- 9. Health Department Contract - Mr. Canter requested opinions from Council and Mayor Patzer. Discussion followed. Mr. Rothwell moved to accept the Franklin County Health Contract with the stipulation that the

11. The Law Director advised that ordinance for Peddlers Permits had not yet been prepared.

12. The Garbage Contract was discussed and Mr. Rothwell presented the contract now in force with Mr. Pleas King. It was determined that Mr. King's contract was presently valid and in force until July 7, 1961.

13. Trash Hauling Contract was discussed. It was determined that Mr. W. A. Griffith's contract with Grove City for hauling trash expired December 31, 1959. Mr. Brinkman moved that Mayor Patzer enter into a contract with Mr. Griffith for a period of one (1) year according to the terms of the contract with Mr. Griffith dated May 18, 1959, further that Mayor Patzer enter into a trash contract with Mr. H. O. Pierson for a period of one (1) year from January 1, 1960.

14. City Engineer advised his contract expires January 9, 1960 and requested permission to submit a new contract. Mr. Mitchell was advised to prepare a new contract and submit same to Council for consideration.

15. Mayor Patzer called on Mr. Beavers regarding the ditch in Barfield Heights. Mr. Beaver advised that the developer was to dig the ditch two (2) feet in depth and he felt this was not adequate. Mr. Mitchell, the City Engineer, agreed. The deepening of this ditch was discussed

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17. Mayor Patzer advised that the Board of Public Affairs continue in office subsequent to the 17th of November under the provisions of Sections 10.02, 10.03, 10.04, and 10.06 of the City Charter, and until such time as the present City Council take steps to provide for a different administration by ordinance.
 18. Mayor Patzer advised he had employed a Secretary.
 19. Mayor Patzer advised he had received requests for building permits and he requested council's advice regarding the issuance of these permits. Council left this matter entirely to the Mayor's discretion.
 20. Mr. Canter advised that Grove City Police Department had purchased Five Thousand (5,000) traffic tickets similar to those used by Columbus Police Department.
 21. Mayor Patzer asked Council if Mr. Beavers was one of their appointees. Mr. Beavers advised the Mayor that he was an employee of the Board of Public Affairs and was responsible to them.
 22. Law Director's fee per attendance at Council Meetings referred to Finance Committee.
 23. Council advised Chief Evans to draw a voucher from Finance Director for Patrolman Birchnell's uniform allowance.
 24. Mr. Edward Brinkman introduced himself and declared his candidacy for County Commissioner.
 25. Council recessed for Finance Committee to meet.
 26. Council reconvened and was called to order by President Norris. Mr. Brinkman reported his committee had tabled the Law Director's fee per meeting.
 27. Mr. Brinkman moved Council adjourn. Seconded by Mr. Rothwell, all voting yes.
