

Held January Fifth (5), 19 60

1. Council met in special session with President Harold Norris in the chair.
2. Roll call showed the following councilmen present: President Harold Norris, Mr. Brinkman, Mr. Rothwell, Mr. Canter, and Mr. Wagner.
Mr. Wagner waived his notice of the meeting.
3. Health Contract: Mr. Brinkman in discussing the Health Contract felt that Franklin County should be awarded the contract as their services were at less cost than the City of Columbus and he felt the county services were adequate enough to serve Grove City's needs.
Mr. Wagner felt that there were three reasons that the county services should be obtained in lieu of the city services. (1) He felt the Columbus contract too expensive, especially since it would necessitate hiring additional help. (2) He did not feel that Grove City should enter into a contract with Columbus due to the ill feeling with local residents over the water contract with Columbus. (3) Mr. Wagner felt eventually that the City of Columbus and Franklin County would have a Health Department that was combined and correlated as one department. He further felt that if Grove City had the necessary funds to enter into a Health Contract with the City of Columbus that that would be the thing to do since Columbus did offer greater services.
Mr. Norris was against entering into a contract with the county and he expressed various reasons. He felt it was hardly possible for Franklin County to give the same services or do an equal amount of work when the county had such a small personnel compared with the City's. Mr. Norris felt that the city contract would offer everything Grove City would need and the county did not.
Mr. Rothwell did not feel that Grove City should enter into a Health Contract with the City of Columbus for any services, due to past experiences with Columbus, particularly the water contract. He also felt that the cost of the Columbus services was a large factor in choosing the Franklin County Health Department over the City of Columbus.
Mr. Canter felt that Columbus offered the best services and the most services. However, since the cost of the services seemed to be such an important factor that, he was of necessity, in favor of the county. However, he expressed that the four months cancellation clause with the county could be put to use in the event Franklin County services were

not up to council's expectations.

Mayor Patzer felt that this matter was important enough to place on the ballot and put before the people of Grove City in order to raise necessary funds for an adequate Health Department. Mr. Patzer drew a similie between our problems with the Health Department and the problems that the Jackson Township Fire Department had in recently passing a levy which they felt was necessary for adequate service to the residents of Grove City and he further stated that when the Fire Department explained that these additional funds were necessary in order to protect the homes and belongings of the residents of Grove City that the people passed it by a large majority giving the Fire Department the necessary funds to operate efficiently.

Mr. Wagner felt that the Southwestern City School District should help pay for the nurse since the school children in the schools were the ones who were availing themselves of the majority of its services.

Mr. Norris again after hearing the discussions pro and con explained that he was not satisfied with the county contract but since money was playing such an important part in their decision that he would go along with giving the contract to the county instead of the city.

Mr. Brinkman moved to accept the County Health Contract with the stipulation that the four month cancelling clause be included in the contract and further that the Health Contract spell out the specific services they would perform. Mr. Rothwell seconded. A roll call vote was taken.

- 4. C. R. -1-59 - Declaring it necessary to enlarge and reconstruct the Sewage Disposal Plant and acquire land therefor.

The City Engineer estimated its cost at \$464,000.00. Mr. Mitchell explained that only three plans were considered workable. (1) Constructing a new sewage treatment plant on White Road. (2) To expand and increase the capacity of the existing sewage plant. (3) To construct a trunk sewer to the sewage treatment plant. Mr. Mitchell explained these three plans were workable and deserving of serious consideration.

Subsequently plan #2 was adopted. This plan suggested the existing plant be expanded to provide a capacity of one million, one hundred thousand gallons per day, which is about 3.7 times the size of the original plant. At the time of his report there were about 2,000 sewer connections in Grove City which represented the estimated equivalent of a population somewhere between 7000 and 7500 persons. By increasing the size of the plant as proposed it would provide for a population increase to about 11,000 persons. The plan was adopted and as presently designed conforms thereto. Plans and specifications are complete and ready for granting of contracts as soon as funds are available. The financing of this project was discussed at length. Mr. Wagner moved that Ordinance CR-1-59 - Declaring it necessary to enlarge and reconstruct the Sewage Disposal Plant and acquire land therefor be accepted. This was seconded by Mr. Rothwell. A roll call vote was taken.


