January 22, 1990

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the 22nd day of January, 1990 at 8:00 p.m. in the court room of the Municipal Safety Building, 3360 Park Street with the following members present:

2. Mr. Cotton moved to dispense the reading of the minutes; seconded by Mr. Mountain.

3. President Nicholson read Resolution No. CR-6-90 (To Larry Finley) and Mayor Stage presented a copy of the resolution to Office Finley, retired.

President Nicholson read Resolution No. CR-7-90 (To Ronald Gabriel) and Mayor Stage presented a copy of the resolution of Police Chief Gabriel, retired.

4. Mr. Cotton introduced Grove City High School principal, Tom Rutan and Band Director George Edge who gave a short talk on the band's trip to California and the Tournament of Roses parade and showed a video tape film of the band marching in the parade and other activities while in California. After the film, Mr. Edge presented a plaque to the Mayor and the City as a sponsor and a large color picture of the band for framing.

5. Council recessed to committees.

6. Thomas Kelley, Josephene Circle questioned the statements made in Ordinance No. C-6-90 (stacking of firewood). A discussion followed about the health hazards of wood being stored on the ground.

7. Jim Schimmoller spoke for the Chamber of Commerce and reported activities of the Chamber for the next month.

9. Ordinance No. C-3-90 (Special Use Permit for American Legion) was given its second reading and public hearing and Mr. Cotton moved it be approved; seconded by Mr. Mountain.

11. Ordinance No. C-8-90 (Special Use permit for bar and restaurant) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be on February 5.
12. Ordinance No. C-9-90 (Rezone at Broadway & Venture) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be on February 19.
13. Ordinance No. C-10-90 (Special Use for car wash at above location) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be on February 5.
14. Ordinance No. C-6-90 (Amend code for firewood) was given its first reading. Although it was written as an emergency measure, Mr. Nicholson announced it would have a second reading on February 5.
15. Ordinance No. C-1-90 (Contract with ODOT for I-71 landscaping) was given its second reading and public hearing and Mr. Mountain moved it be approved; seconded by Mr. Nicholson.

17. Mayor Stage gave his report for the month of December and Mr. Nicholson moved it be accepted; seconded by Mr. Mountain.


