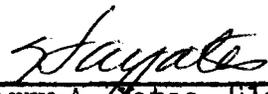


MINUTES FOR GROVE CITY, OHIO COUNCIL  
February 16, 1959

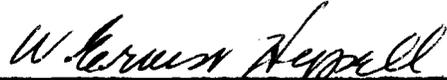
AGENDA ITEM

- Item 1. Meeting called to order by Mayor. Invocation given by Rev. Sam Armstrong. On roll call all members of Council were present.
- Item 2. On motion to approve minutes as printed made by Harrington, 2nd by Brinkman, all voted yea.
- Item 3. In the matter of the open ditch from Broadway to west end of Dennis Lane, Engineer suggested that same could be cut off at west line of Jackson homes and construct a new sewer line to Republican run @ \$18,000.00. Results on a motion that present relief cut of the ditch be sandbagged and refilled to natural height made by Harrington, 2nd Brinkman all members voting yea.
- Item 4. In the matter of Flanagan water, the water problem is on the Flanagan property where a drain sewer was cut during construction and it is his problem to take care of same.
- Discussion by various parties represented at Council meeting concerning water problems resulted in the matter that it would cost approximately \$1,000,000.00 to make storm sewer corrections all of which would have to be corrected by general bond issue.
- Item 5. Bids were opened concerning bids on cruiser: from West Side Motors, Rodenfel's Chevrolet, Beasley-Grove, and Bud Hedges Chevrolet Co. After examination of same a motion to purchase same from Bud Hedges Chevrolet Company, Baltimore, Ohio was made by Rothwell, 2nd by Brinkman and same was approved by roll call vote. Yeas were: Hinton, Kiehl, Rothwell, Brinkman, Harrington, and Haughn.
- Item 6. In the matter of partitioning off waiting room area in the Police Department by a counter partition, at cost of \$95.00 on a motion made by Kiehl, 2nd Haughn on a roll call the yeas were Hinton, Kiehl, Rothwell, Brinkman, Harrington, and Haughn.
- Item 7. In the matter of employee's pay a letter was submitted by Police and Street departments for requests of pay increases together with the recommended pay adjustments for Board of Public Affairs employees as submitted by them through a report by the Clerk and Mr. Von Jasinski. The matter for Police and Street Department could not be resolved, so same was referred for study and ordinance to be presented at next meeting of Council on motion by Haughn, 2nd Hinton all voted yea.
- Item 8. Uniforms for street department was passed to include same with pay raise study.
- Item 9. In the matter of part time clerk-typist for Clerk's office at a salary of \$100.00 per month, on a motion to approve same made by Kiehl, 2nd Haughn, a roll call vote taken was as follows - yeas, Hinton, Kiehl, Rothwell, Brinkman, Harrington, Haughn.
- Item 10. Solicitor ordered to draft resolution to freeze building permits as an emergency measure because of water problems, to protect the health, welfare and safety made on motion by Haughn, 2nd Brinkman all voting yea.

- Item 11. Engineer to meet with clerk to survey costs to be recovered caused by flood damages.
- Item 12. Planning Commission reported their approval of the following matters:  
Melvin Girbert construction of apartment building on Kingston Avenue.  
David's Market permission to blacktop yard west of their building for parking.  
Demco Company proposed expansion to include property east and adjoining their present plant and rezoning approximately 10 feet of said property to industrial use.
- Item 13. Engineer reported again the meeting scheduled February 20th before County Commissioners requested that large attendance be present.  
Had a meeting with Mr. L. J. Reimer financial adviser who suggested our making application for Federal Grant aid on new Disposal Plant Construction.
- Item 14. Ordered street department to remove two pieces of curbing on Dennis Lane.
- Item 15. Flasher lights have been received by street department.
- Item 16. Loading Zone matter postponed awaiting report from Business Men.
- Item 17. Passed pending report from Business men.
- Item 18. No Ordinances.
- Item 19. Resolution A 2-59 Clerk authorized to make application for Federal Grant Aid on new Disposal Plant, on motion to adopt by Hinton, 2nd Harrington a ll voted yea.
- Item 20 and 21 No second or third readings.
- Item 22. Motion to pay bills by Hinton, 2nd Harrington all voting yea.  
Motion to adjourn by Haughn, 2nd Kiehl all voting yea.
