

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

February 26, 1951

Meeting called to order at 8:00 by Frank Weygandt acting Mayor. Those present were Compton, Farnsworth, Noble, Smith and Weygandt.

Bids for ditches and new storm sewers were delivered to the clerk; acting mayor Weygandt announced that the bidding period was closed. Motion was made by Compton and seconded by Noble that the clerk open bids and announce prices bid. Motion carried unanimously.

Three bids were received, opened and read as follows:

Thompson-Conie, 1340 Windsor Ave., Columbus, Ohio, a certified check for \$1,000.00 was enclosed. Bid for Contract A only.

O. E. Liller, London, Ohio, a certified check for \$1,000.00 on Contract A and a certified check for \$500.00 on Contract B. Bid was for both Contract A and B.

George J. Igel & Co., Inc., 501 Eaton Ave., Columbus 8, Ohio, a certified check in the amount of \$1,500.00 was enclosed, \$1,000.00 for bid on Contract A, and \$500.00 for bid on Contract B.

Motion was made by Compton and seconded by Smith that the bids be referred to the engineer for tabulation and report. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. R. W. Haines presented a proposal, and asked for the support of the village council in obtaining additional small industry to be located in Grove City. The village council agreed to give whatever support was possible.

Motion was made by Noble and seconded by Compton that the village purchase all their gas, oil and servicing from one service station for a period not to exceed four months. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Noble and seconded by Compton that the bill from the Myron T. Jones Engineering Co., Inc. for services rendered in making survey of the village water works. Amount of bill \$100.00.

Acting Mayor Weygandt requested the engineer's tabulation and report, the engineer's report was as follows:

Thompson-Conie, Contract A - \$40,862.50 - no bid for Contract B.

O. E. Liller, Contract A as specified in plans - \$42,073.00 with a substitution of 60" pipe for 54". The price for Contract A would be \$37,473.00. O. E. Liller bid for Contract B, \$10,250.00

George J. Igel, bid \$49,280.00 on Contract A and \$4,275.00 for Contract B.

Farnsworth read communication from Glenn Lotz regarding terms and agreements concerning the continued use of the present village dump. Terms and agreements are as follows: all willow trees to be cut down and covered, area in rear of dump to be dozed to grade level of ground North and covered with minimum of 6" of earth, sufficient earth to be piled on graded area so as to cover balance of dump at later date as needed. No burning unless rubber from chemical plant is prohibited and only then if under supervision. In the past the only one other than Mr. Evans given permission by me to use the dump has been the race track. I received \$50.00 in the past two years for this privilege, however, I was led to believe that the race track would do the grading at no cost to the village. If this is not being done they too may be excluded. It is understood that as a gentleman's agreement the village may continue to use said dump until agreements are completed.

Motion was made by Noble and seconded by Compton that the Engineer be directed to prepare forms for receipt of bids for improvement of the softening equipment at the Grove City Water Works. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Smith and seconded by Noble that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried unanimously.
