9. During discussion of Resolution CR-12-84 (Modify Development Plan), Charles Pappas, Leithart Drive, voiced his opposition to the use of Federal Funds for the Urbancrest Hotel & Convention Center. He also stated that he understands that Grove City has no control over this center. Mr. List stated that Mr. Pappas should contact our representative, Mr. Chalmers Wylie and the two Senators from Ohio, John Glenn and Howard Metzenbaum

During discussion of Ordinance C-19-84 (Collection Service for unpaid fines and court costs), Mr. Pappas questioned why isn't police and city attorney power used to commit the persons to jail for nonpayment of fine. Mr. List, Mr. Gunderman and Chief Gabriel answered by stating the cost per day for a prisoner, certain state laws about this matter and the cost of warrents put out for people that live out of Grove City or Franklin County.

On Ordinance C-6-84 (S/W Community Health Centers, Inc.), James Gibson, Director of S/W Community Health Centers spoke to council and asked that the decision on this ordinance be delayed until May to give time for more information to be assembled. Mr. List read a letter from Mr. Childress, Chairman of the Board of S/W asking for this ordinance's delay until May.
