April 7, 1986

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the seventh day of April, 1986 at 8:00 p.m. in the council chambers with the following members present:

Michael Brandt, former Mayor, expressed his appreciation for the support of the council and administration for the track. He stated that the name of the track will return to Beulah Park; that the history is going to come back


