1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the 15th day of April, 1985 in the council chambers with the following members present:

6. Council recessed to committees.
7. Ordinances C-23-85, C-24-85 and C-25-85, all pay ordinances, were given lengthy discussions by Charles Pappas, Charles Boso, Robert Behlen, the council and Mayor Evans. Mayor Evans urged the passage of these ordinances. Mr. List asked if any of the city employees that were in attendance wanted to speak to the ordinances. None spoke to the ordinances.
8. During discussion of Ordinance C-30-85, Mr. Gunderman, City attorney, stated that the project was nearly completed and that he had been informed that the easement for this sewer line has been recorded and dedicated to the city; that council had not approved the sewer as city property nor had council accepted; that no agreement between the City and the Farmer's Exchange had been signed. Mr. Gunderman recommended that this ordinance be tabled again until he can work out these details with the attorney for the Farmer's Exchange.
