April 16, 1990

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the 16th day of April, 1990 at 8:00 p.m. in the Municipal Safety Building with the following members present:

4. Council recessed to committees.
5. After discussion of agenda items, Mr. Pete Booth, owner of That Place Restaurant and Bar, asked Council to override the Mayor's veto of Ordinance No. C-8-90 (Special use permit).

There followed a lengthy discussion of the Mayor's veto based on the City Attorney's written legal opinion on this ordinance, the legal opinion, the consent of the owner of the off-site parking area, and the return of the parking plans and arrangements to the Planning Commission.

Mr. Cotton moved to override the Mayor's veto on Ordinance No. C-8-90. The motion was not seconded. Motion lost.

6. Mark List, Jackson Township Trustee, expressed his appreciation of the communications between the trustees and the city and the receipt of the city council minutes. Mr. List stated that beginning in July

the Trustees will meet on Tuesday night thereby eliminating a conflict of meeting dates with the City Council and the Southwestern City School Board.

Mayor Stage replied he appreciated the comments of Trustee List and offered the city facilities at the Safety Building and certainly at the new City Hall.
