April 17, 1989

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the seventeenth day of April, 1989 in the Senior Center, Windsor Park.

The meeting opened with a moment of silent prayer and remembrance of George A. Yates a former council member and President of Council from 1966 to December 1970.

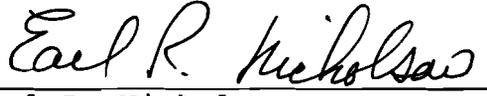
Mayor Stage reported the groundbreaking for the Municipal Building will be Saturday, April 22 at 10:00 a.m.
