May 16, 1994

Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of Council was called to order by President Cheryl Grossman at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, 4035 Broadway.

1. Ordinance C-36-94 (Accept the Plat of Meadowgrove, Section 4) was given its second reading and public hearing and Mr. Hurley moved it be approved; seconded by President Grossman.

The Chair recognized Mr. Schreck, Chairman of Safety, for discussion and voting of legislative agenda items under said committee.

1. Ordinance C-40-94 (Authorize continued membership in the Central Ohio Health Care Consortium) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be held on June 6, 1994.

Mr. Behlen explained that this is our third year in the self-insured program and we have gained a very stable environment for our health coverage. This ordinance will authorize the continued participation in the program.

2. Ordinance C-42-94 (Authorize the Admin. Asst. to enter into an agree. with the Ohio Banc Auction) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be held on June 6, 1994.

The Chair recognized Mr. Milovich, Chairman of Finance, for discussion and voting of legislative agenda items under said committee.

1. Ordinance C-39-94 (Appropriate \$37,486.00 from the Community Development Fund for the current expense of the Farmbrook Tree Planting Program) was given its first reading and since it appropriates for current expenses, Mr. Milovich moved it be approved; seconded by President Grossman.

a vast amount of hunting in the area occurring illegally and shots were coming through houses - no. As it is, he feels that a park setting is appropriate.


President Grossman also added that in her conversations with Chief McKean, this area has been placed in a Priority Category and when calls come in, there is immediate response.
