

22. In his remarks, Mayor Stage asked for a resolution of objection to issuance of a D5 and D6 liquor permit for T&W Beverage, Inc., Stringtown Road.

Mayor Stage explained the reasons for the rate increase for garbage and refuse service and stated that prior to another rate increase, the city and the franchise holder explore the possibility of a recycling program, rate reductions for senior citizens, a compost facility and a limitation on the amount of trash without additional charges.
