
16. Ordinance No. C-92-89 (Purchase 6+ acres in Keller Farm East) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be on October 16.

The two men in the car that caused the accident were killed and had blood alcohol content of 0.26 and 0.20. Mr. List wants to reenforce the Council's opposing additional liquor permit holders in the city and encourages the administration to continue the efforts to curb drunk driving within the city.
