November 3, 1980

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City, Ohio met in regular session on November 3, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. in the council chambers with the following members present:

Approximately 20 residents attended the meeting and held discussion with the council and the administration. Residents speaking to council were: Diane James, Roy Brown, Gary Carter, Joanne McQuaid Tom Buchanan and Dick Gilmore. After discussion, President Hampson set the date of December 16 for the residents of Westgrove to again meet with council during the regular meeting for a progress report on lots, streets and ditch problems.

Barbara Sheets, Olive Street, spoke to council and asked progress on sewer repairs and EPA monies for that section of the city.


13. Mayor Evans gave his report for the month and Mr. Margello moved it be accepted; seconded by Mr. Dooley.


