December 20, 1982

Regular Meeting

1. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the 20th day of December in the council chambers with the following members present:

During discussion of C-80-82 (Contract with Columbus City Prosecutor's Office), Mr. Douglas stated he would like the record to reflect certain budgetary constraints to be used including a cut in the line expenditure for this particular contract and he further stated that he would like the record to reflect that there was discussion by the council that this particular contract would be reviewed by council and the expenditures thereon in six months to make sure that it complies with the amount budgeted for this contract.

During discussion of C-83-82 (1983 Appropriations), President Weygandt thanked the council and the administration for the amount of time put forth to make this a balanced budget.

During general remarks, Mr. Hampson stated that he would like the council to consider and examine by detailed inspection the current city wages, the current civil service steps, and a modernization of those so they come into line with suburbs in our area and so that our wages and steps reflect continuity across the board within the divisions of the city's work force. Mr. Hampson further stated that he feels the council should look to appointing a committee to study this and come back to council with recommendations. He would like to see this committee composed of people who are not in the administration or council; that will not tend to benefit from any recommendations that are made so that it cannot be assumed to be a political move or a move for additional wages--a committee composed of citizens or people not seeking re-election to a city position.
