December 28, 1981

Regular Meeting

1. The regularly scheduled meeting of council for December 21, the third Monday in the month, was canceled because of inclement weather.
2. The Council of the City of Grove City met in regular session on the 28th day of December, 1981 at 8:00 p.m. in the council chambers with the following members present:

8. Chris Fulton, Safety Director spoke to council about a loading zone on Broadway for Sharp's Auction House; introduced Mr. Minillo, attorney for Mr. Sharp, who led a lengthy discussion about the loading zone. Also speaking to this matter were Jack Weygandt and James McDonald.
9. Mrs. Ruddy, 2898 Parlin Drive spoke to council about installing a float switch in a manhole on Parlin Drive and a red light on a nearby building to warn of flooding of the storm sewer. Mrs. Ruddy and Mr. Lucician, apartment manager, left with the Clerk a proposal and estimate of the cost of this installation.
