

Held December Thirtieth (30), 1959

1. Council met in Special Session with President Harold Norris in the Chair.
2. Roll call showed the following Councilmen present: President Harold Norris, Gerald Brinkman, Russell Canter and Robert Wagner.
3. Brinkman moved that the minutes be accepted as written by the clerk, for the meeting of December 21, 1959. Seconded by Wagner, all voting yes.
4. President Norris asked if any Councilmen had any communications, petitions, motions, original ordinances or resolutions. Mr. Wagner advised he would be unable to attend the next regularly scheduled meeting on January 4, 1960.
5. Mayor Patzer advised that his office had collected a total of \$508.00 in fines, \$8.00 in parking tickets, plus \$100.00 for the sale of a speed-meter to Darbydale, Ohio for a total of \$616.00. Mayor Patzer requested Council give consideration to the letting of bids for garbage and trash collections. Mr. Wagner moved that bids for garbage and/or trash collections be published and advised in the publication that a license fee of \$25.00 would be charged by the City, further, that the winner of the bid would be under contract to the city, and requested the Law Director to submit, in writing to the clerk, a notice for publication. Mr. Brinkman seconded. A roll call vote was taken.

6. The Law Director was requested to draw up a notice for bids on Contract for Gasoline, Oil and the general maintenance of all equipment.
7. Mayor Patzer advised that Grove City Auto Parts Company had failed to comply with the Ordinance to regulate junk yards. The height of the fence was not according to code, the automobiles in the front of their building were not fenced at all, that a health problem was evident due to the junk yard. This matter was thoroughly discussed and council will see that measures are taken to correct this situation.
8. Mayor Patzer advised that he had been questioned regarding the alley at the rear of the Donald Newhouse residence. That the previous Council had closed the alley at the request of adjacent home owners and Mr. Newhouse wondered what steps should be taken if he and other adjacent neighbors wanted to reopen the alley.

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9. Mayor Patzer suggested that the building, plumbing and electrical inspection be done on a part time basis by local men in these respective fields, until such time as permanent inspectors may be employed by the city.
10. New Traffic Tickets were to be ordered as the Police Department is nearly out. Mr. Canter, Chairman of the Safety Committee, was to order the traffic tickets and they should follow the pattern of Columbus, Ohio Traffic Violation tickets, showing ordinance numbers and amount of fines on their reverse side.
11. Resolution #CR-1-59 - Declaring it necessary to enlarge and reconstruct the Sewage Disposal Plant of Grove City will be ready for Council action at the next regular meeting, date of January 4, 1960.
12. Law Director Thomas was requested to appear with Mayor Patzer at Traffic Court on Saturday Mornings at his regular hourly rate of pay. Mr. Thomas advised that it would only take a few additional hours each month.
13. Council requested the Law Director draw proper ordinances for peddlers permits whether for gain or charity.
14. Council adjourned and met as a committee on the whole. Mr. Canter was appointed Chairman pro-tempore for discussion of Grove City's proposed health contract.

Mr. Canter read a letter from the State of Ohio, Department of Health which outlined specifics necessary for properly administering an adequate health department for Grove City, signed by E. A. Grabner, Assistant Chief of Bureau of Local Service.

Dr. Ollie Goodloe was introduced and proceeded to outline what he felt were basic needs for an adequate health department. He exhibited booklets, charts, Columbus, Ohio expenditures, and other data he felt necessary to make a proper decision.

Mr. Reynolds of the Franklin County Department of Health then proceeded to outline benefits of the County Health system and its aids and benefits and further advised that the budget for their program is based on tax valuation, that they avail themselves of the use of the State of Ohio Health Laboratory at Ohio State University. Mr. Reynolds advised that the County would render all the services to Grove City

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that the City of Columbus would render except treatment of alcoholism, and that the cost of these services from the County would be considerably less than the services of the Columbus Health Department, and under either a contract with the City or the County, Grove City would be partially subsidized by the Government.

Dr. James Henry spoke, saying that he was vitally interested in the best possible health service for the citizens of Grove City and that he felt specific health helps should be spelled out in the Grove City Charter, or ordinances. Dr. Henry felt a full or part time nurse should be employed by Grove City, and that the new Southwestern City School Board should help in underwriting its expense.

Mr. Canter asked Dr. Henry if he would accept the post of City Health Commissioner. Dr. Henry replied that if the appropriations budget would not permit an adequate health department, that he would be more than willing to accept the position in the sole interest of public service.

15. Mayor Patzer appointed Mr. Howard Reynolds temporary Health Commissioner until January 4, 1960.
16. Council reconvened and was called to order by President Norris.
17. Mr. Canter moved to table the health contract discussion, seconded by Wagner.
18. Brinkman moved the meeting adjourn, seconded by Wagner. Meeting adjourned.
