MAYOR'S COLUMN: Our Dream Field - A Source of Pride

I recently attended the final meeting of the Grove City Little League® Board and felt a warm blend of appreciation, nostalgia and an abundance of pride.

It was five years ago when I asked several Grove City community leaders, who played Little League® baseball at Windsor Park in the 1950s, to help Grove City return Little League® to our community. Grove City enjoyed the many team and friendship building benefits a Little League® program instills in a community from May 1950 (the first central Ohio community to offer Little League®) through 1982. Due in no small part to the dedication and enthusiasm of the Little League® Board, in May 2013, the most recognized and respected name in youth sports returned to Grove City.

Before the opening day dust settled, the Board decided the world's largest organized youth sports program should be enjoyed by central Ohio children of all abilities. Their dream was to create a special stadium and field, comingled with Windsor Park's other diamonds, designed for players in wheelchairs, walkers and crutches. Nothing was going to stand in the way of their new mission, including a fundraising goal that seemed insurmountable. The Board knew they could count on the community, but never imagined the regional and national help coming their way.

They worked tirelessly meeting with individuals, businesses and community groups to organize fundraising events and share the vision of building a field for kids who could only dream of playing the sport they, as children, grew to cherish. Each player would have a volunteer "Buddy" to assist with batting, running and throwing, serving as a personal cheerleader.

While fundraising, the Board took on an additional challenge of spreading the word and obtaining more than 600 signatures to apply for an Ohio specialty plate, "Baseball for All," that would help provide annual funding to maintain the field, once it was built.

With an almost indescribable amount of pride on May 21, I watched Mr. Jim DiBlasi throw the opening day pitch at Grove City's Mirolo Dream Field at Mount Carmel Stadium. I will be telling everyone with immense enthusiasm about our Dream Field when they ask me what "Baseball for All" means on my license plate.

My many thanks and appreciation for the vision and work of this small group of community leaders is certainly inadequate. So, please join me in thanking Ron Gabriel, Jimmie Harris, Gary Haughn, Jay Pozz, Ryan Sines, Larry Thomas, Jack Widner and Don Walters when you see them at Windsor Park cheering for their Grove City Little League® and Buddy Ball teams. They are easy to identify, often wearing red Little League® Board member shirts and broad smiles.

I love this community.



Grove City Is Central Ohio's Best Hometown - Again

Grove City became the first central Ohio community to repeat as Ohio Magazine's "Best Hometown" based on the values that make our state a great place to live.

"This is an honor that belongs to the residents and business community in Grove City," said Mayor Richard L. "Ike" Stage. "We are proud of our small town feel while we continue to grow. Central Ohio's best hometown is what we work to accomplish – every day."

Each year, Ohio Magazine editors select one community from each of the four regions in the state. Communities apply for the award by highlighting the special qualities their residents treasure: community spirit, culture and heritage; education; health and safety; and the attractions and events that make them proud. Grove City was first recognized by the magazine for 2012-2013.

Grove City Parks and Recreation Earns Reaccreditation

The Grove City Parks and Recreation Department recently earned reaccreditation from the National Parks and Recreation Association (NPRA). The department obtained its initial accreditation in 2006 and is one of 141 total departments across the United States who hold this distinction.

Staff worked together over the past year to prepare a self assessment and collect supporting documentation to address a set of key standards the NPRA requires organizations to meet to receive the distinction. Representatives from other parks and recreation departments from around the country spent several days this summer in Grove City reviewing the information and observing the department at work.

Representing Grove City, Parks and Recreation Department Director Kim Conrad accepted the award at the NPRA national convention in St. Louis in October.

Local Waste Services observes Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. There is no collection the day of the holiday and pickup is delayed one day for the remainder of the week. Routes normally collected on Fridays are serviced on Saturday that week.

There is no collection Thu., 11/24 for Thanksgiving. With Christmas and New Year's Day falling on Sunday, collection is not impacted.

Christmas Tree Collection: trees are collected up to two weeks after Christmas. Remove all decorations and place the tree at the curb. Do not put it in a plastic bag or bind with wire or plastic.

Recycling Carts: a new agreement between LWS and the city includes a 65-gallon wheeled recycling cart for residential customers. All red carts will be delivered by Friday, Dec. 30.

Weather Emergencies

Whenever there is a snowfall of two or more inches and it is deemed a hazard to transportation, a snow emergency is declared. During a snow emergency, there is no parking on city streets marked with snow emergency signage; unattended vehicles are towed at the owner's expense. Snow emergencies are declared and lifted by the City administration. The City updates the website and issues an e-newsletter and Facebook and Twitter updates with every weather emergency. Snow emergencies declared by the Grove City administration are not related to snow emergencies declared by the Franklin County Sheriff's Office which may restrict use of roadways by motor vehicles. Visit sheriff.franklincountyohio.gov/info for information.

Weekdays (before 4 p.m.)

Full-day School Cancellations: if South-Western City Schools (SWCS) close due to inclement weather, all Parks and Recreation classes offered with start times 4 p.m. or earlier are canceled. This encompasses activities not at school locations including the Gantz Barn and Evans Center. The Evans Center transportation program is closed when school is closed.

School Delays: a decision by SWCS to delay the start of the school day has no impact on the schedule for Parks and Recreation activities.

Weeknights (4 p.m. and later)

The decision to conduct or cancel evening classes and programs at non-school locations is made by 3 p.m. However, programs scheduled at SWCS sites are canceled for the evening if school is closed.

Weekends

In the case of severe snow or ice on Saturday or Sunday, a decision to conduct programs and classes is made by 8 a.m. on Saturday and noon on Sunday.

Grove City Community Watch Volunteers Support Police and the Community

The Grove City Community Watch Volunteer program supports the City of Grove City and the Grove City Division of Police by contributing a new level of safety in Grove City through their efforts to reduce crime and automobile accidents, assist with critical incidents, and communicate issues of community concern.

Members of the program are civilian volunteers and graduates of the Grove City Division of Police Citizens Police Academy who receive specialized training and work with police officers to highlight safety concerns. They foster increased community awareness through activities such as distributing theft prevention notices on vehicles and property and aiding police at special events.

During 2016, Community Watch members volunteered more than 1,500 hours and Citizens Police Academy more than 1,000 hours. Their presence and involvement promotes goodwill and community safety. Watch for the Grove City Division of Police "Community Watch" vehicle around town! Four new members will join the program in 2017.

The **Grove City Online Police Reporting System** allows residents to submit non-emergency incident reports through an easy-to-use reporting tool for crimes not in progress or involving injuries, suspects or crime scene evidence. Reports are reviewed and assigned a case number if appropriate, and users are sent a copy by email. For information, visit GroveCityOhio.gov/division-of-police/online-reporting or call 614-277-1740.

The Division of Police uses **Smart911** to improve responsiveness during emergencies. Create a household profile at www.smart911.com and, if you call 911 in a participating community from a phone linked to your profile (cell phones included), your information is displayed on the 911 call taker's screen so dispatchers can share it with first responders.

A **Rx Drug Drop Box** is available in the Grove City Safety Complex lobby for anonymous disposal of medicine (solid forms only) day or night.

S.A.L.T. (Seniors and Law Enforcement Together) meets at 1 p.m. the second Tuesday of each month at the Evans Center. Representatives from Grove City Police and Jackson Township Fire share information about community services and crime and safety issues important to seniors. Shelters are available to the public year-round, dawn to dusk, and are open to use if not already reserved. Check the reservation sheets mounted on the shelters for walk-up availability.

Rental reservations for all outdoor shelters and the gazebo are accepted each year beginning in mid-January and are offered on a first-come basis. Make reservations in either or both of two time slots. Rental fees are due at the time of reservation and are subject to change. Weddings in the Gardens at Gantz are by special permission only. Renters wanting to use a shelter's electricity can obtain an access key up to three days before the reserved date for a \$25 deposit due at pickup; this fee is refunded upon return of the key.

Community Parks/Amenities

The Big Splash Family Aquatics Center (Seasonal)



Purchase a season pass or just pay for the day (residents or season pass holders and their guests only) and enjoy a variety of amenities including zero-depth entry, interactive water toys, a six-lane lap pool, a large body slide, a tot slide and two aquatic climbing walls. Out-of-the-water features include relaxing green space, lounge chairs, shade structures, presentation stage and a concession stand. Open daily Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day when South-Western City Schools are not in session.

Breck Community Park



This park features walking and biking trails and a large pond. One-third of the park is reserved for fenced-in, off-leash dog areas divided into four sections, two each for larger (35 pounds and heavier) and smaller (34 pounds and lighter) dogs. These areas are rotated to maintain ground cover.

Fryer Park



This educational and recreational destination offers options for every interest and season: be transported to the 1800s with authentic period buildings at Century Village, explore a space-themed play zone appropriate for all developmental abilities at Discovery Frontier; relax, fish and picnic by Rotary Lake; or enjoy a movie under the summer stars or coast down the sledding hill after a snowfall. Other features include eight softball fields, miles of trails, and the Eagle Pavilion at Rotary Lake, a four-season shelter available for rental by Grove City and Jackson Township residents. The Grove City YMCA is located on the grounds of the park.

Gantz Park



Walking paths through rolling terrain, a gazebo and wooded nature areas create the perfect setting for a stroll or picnic. This classroom of the natural world features professionally landscaped, themed herb gardens at the Gardens at Gantz. These gardens, anchored by the historic farmhouse, plus a meditative labyrinth and arboretum are key destinations in central Ohio. Shelter houses, a large playground and tennis and basketball courts keep families entertained. The Gantz Barn accommodates the RecSchool, preschool program.

Grove City Skate Park



This state-of-the-art skate facility for skateboarders and in-line skaters offers something for every interest and skill level. The bowl boasts smooth concrete walls spanning three to 18 feet in height. Those preferring a street style can take advantage of ramps, blocks, rails and boxes.

Henceroth Park



This eco-friendly, "green" park features solar lighting, a wooded nature trail and playground equipment made from recycled materials. A walk/run/bike path with exercise equipment, a butterfly garden and bluebird boxes are also noteworthy features. Several military tributes are located in this park.

Windsor Park



This popular Grove City destination features 11 ball diamonds and batting cages serving preschoolers through adults of all skill levels in youth baseball and adult softball, four lighted tennis courts, a playground and a large shelter house. It is also home to the Evans Center, the hub for a multitude of programs and services for individuals 55 and older, and a specialized baseball field for youth with physical and mental challenges.

This rentable indoor facility with a warming kitchen and restrooms offers residents the opportunity to host an event in a beautiful park atmosphere during any season.

The Evans Center

4330 Dudley Ave.

This 14,000-square-foot facility is home to diverse, cost-efficient, recreational, educational and health services for adults 55+, and program space for all ages. It serves as a hot-meal site for LifeCare Alliance's Meals-on-Wheels program.

Fryer House

3899 Orders Road

At the entrance to Fryer Park, this facility offers program space for select youth programs; there are no public hours.

Gantz Barn

2259 Home Road

This two-story barn hosts a variety of youth programs including the RecSchool early childhood program and enrichment classes. The Gantz Barn is not available for general public use.

Gantz Farmhouse

2255 Home Road

Herbs rule this historic farmhouse, home to the Gardens at Gantz volunteers and site of plant-focused workshops and classes.

George Edge Music Park on Broadway

Town Center Plaza, Park St. at Broadway

Central to many activities in Grove City's historic heart, the plaza hosts the Summer Sizzle Concert Series and is home to the community Christmas tree each December.

Grant Homestead

4126 Haughn Road

The historic home of the Grant family is under development.

Grove City Community Disc Golf Course

4770 Hoover Road

This 18-hole course on the grounds of the Grove City Church of the Nazarene allows groups of friends and families to experience the outdoors with a sport that can be enjoyed by all skill levels.

Kingston Center

3226 Kingston Ave.

Site of a former school, this facility offers space for a monthly blood drive and a variety of recreational activities.

Town Center Promenade

3442 Park St.

The parking area east of Broadway between Park Street and Grant Avenue transforms into an event space during celebrations.

Volunteer Youth Coaches

Grove City Parks and Recreation offers team recreational experiences for community youth with the important assistance of many volunteer baseball, volleyball and basketball coaches.

You don't have to be an expert! The department covers the cost of the certification required for head coaches. Baseball coaches are certified through Little League® International and basketball coaches through the National Youth Sports Coaches Association (online training). Coaches also must complete free, online instruction regarding concussions in youth sports.

Many opportunities also exist for assistant coaches to help. To be a volunteer coach, contact the Parks and Recreation office and complete a coaching application.

Any person who assists with any on-field activities is required to pass a background check.

Grove City Little League®

Grove City Parks and Recreation offers a baseball program for boys and girls ages 5-17 that teaches basic skills, sportsmanship, teamwork and enjoyment of the game. Our goal is to make the experience pleasurable for all children, parents and coaches.

Registration (at the Kingston Center)

Register, in person only, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. through 5 p.m., throughout February. Office hours are extended until 7 p.m., Tue., 2/21. Timely registration is important so players can participate in a mandatory observation. The registration form must be signed by a parent/legal guardian.

All-star Teams

Grove City will field two tournament teams each for Minor 9-10 and Major leagues. A player must reside within the Little League®-approved geographic boundary and be within the proper age division to be eligible for an all-star team. A geographic boundary map approved by Little League® International determines eligibility for the all-star team. **This map does not determine fee levels.**

Age and Residency Requirements

All children ages 5-17 who live in Grove City or Jackson Township are eligible to participate at resident rates. Participants who reside outside the city/township corporate limits are eligible to play, but are required to pay an additional \$10 non-resident fee.

Grove City accepts players regardless of geographic location. However, any player who resides outside of the boundary is not eligible to play for an all-star team.





Residency Rates & Fair Share Policy

The lower "resident rate" provides credit to those paying municipal taxes that help support the programs and events offered by the City of Grove City. To qualify as a resident, a person must live or work in Grove City or Jackson Township. This does not include all of ZIP code 43123; ZIP codes are used by the U.S. Postal Service to designate the office that delivers mail to an address. Visit FranklinCountyAuditor.com to check your address. Grove City parcel IDs start with 040; unincorporated Jackson Township with 160.

Through the City of Grove City Fair Share Policy, non-residents who pay income tax to the City of Grove City are eligible to participate at resident rates. To be eligible, non-residents must annually provide proof of employment on company letterhead with the signature of the personnel director or a current pay stub showing the employer's address.
