

WHAT IS CHILD ABUSE?

Child abuse is non-accidental physical injury and assault, sexual abuse, and/or emotional injury of a child.

Examples may include the following:

CHILD NEGLECT:

- Failure to provide even minimal care of a child.
- Failure to provide adequate: Food, clothing, shelter, medical care
- Failure to provide for a child's emotional, social, intellectual, and moral needs.

EMOTIONAL ABUSE:

- Screaming at a child
- Calling names

- Criticisms and put-downs
- Making fun
- Unfavorable comparisons of a child
- Refusal to talk to or listen to a child

SEXUAL ABUSE:

- Suggestive language
- Pornography
- Fondling
- Petting
- Masturbation
- Exhibitionism
- Voyeurism
- Oral sex
- Vaginal or anal intercourse

PHYSICAL ABUSE:

- Shaking a baby
- Excessive corporal punishment
- Bruises from abuse
- Broken bones
- Burns
- Organ damage
- Death

COULD CHILD ABUSE AFFECT ME OR SOMEONE I KNOW?

Child abuse affects all economic and educational levels, all ethnic and racial backgrounds, and all religious groups. Every child must receive watchful care.

HOW CAN I TELL IF MY CHILD HAS BEEN SEXUALLY ABUSED?

Some common signs include:

- Bed-wetting
- Nightmares
- Lack of concentration
- Dramatic change in personality
- "Clingy" behavior
- Insistent dislike for someone they're left alone with, such as a baby-sitter or family member.

WHAT CAN I DO IF I SUSPECT A CHILD HAS BEEN ABUSED?

Abused children are not only attacked and hurt, but they are deeply scarred emotionally by the rage and hatred directed against them.

Counseling is a good first step. This may include the following:

- School counselors
- Private counselors
- Hospitals
- Franklin County Children's Services
- Clergy
