

DON'T BE AN EASY TARGET...

- If you must carry a purse, hold it close to your body.
- Never carry a wallet in your back pocket. Place it in an inside jacket pocket or front pocket.
- Always tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Avoid dark deserted routes, even if they are the shortest.
- Carry a charged cell phone, 911 calls are free and can be made on a phone that isn't associated with a wireless provider.



TRANSPORTATION...

- Travel with friends to stores, the bank or the doctor.
- When using the bus or other public transportation, sit near the driver.
- Have your keys in hand as you approach your vehicle and home.
- Be careful when picking up prescriptions.
- If you have car trouble, be wary of strangers who offer help. Stay in your car and ask them to call a service truck or the police. If a friend or taxi takes you home, ask the driver to wait until you are safely inside.
- At all times, communicate a message that you are calm, confident, and you know where you are going. Trust your instincts.



If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, leave.

- Use deadbolt locks on all exterior doors. Keep your doors locked at all times, even when you are inside.
- Make your home appear occupied when you go out by using a timer to turn on lights and a radio.
- Never let strangers into your home without checking their identification. Call the company they represent if you are not certain. Install a peep hole in your door.
- Use only your first initial in phone books, directories and apartment lobbies.

BE ESPECIALLY WARY OF...

- Get rich quick schemes requiring you to put up good faith money.
- Good deals on expensive repairs or home improvement jobs.
- Investments that promise unusually large returns.
- Someone claiming you owe money for an item ordered by a deceased spouse or relative.
- Charity requests, work-at-home schemes, door-to-door sales, supplemental Medicare Insurance, miracle cures, glasses and hearing aids at bargain prices.



PROTECT YOUR MONEY...

- If you receive checks in the mail regularly, arrange for them to be sent to your bank instead.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of money. If you must carry a large amount, have a friend accompany you.
- Don't display large amounts of cash in stores or public places.
- Never place your purse or wallet on a counter or in a cart while you examine merchandise in a store.
